Collect On Delivery Mail Should Be Redeemed Promptly.

THE C. O. D. service between the United States and this office is growing steadily, and during the past six months has increased at least 60%. This is good business, and it is appreciated. However, recent experience indicates that there is developing considerable laxity in the redemption of C. O. D. parcels, due no doubt to the fact that patrons of this service have gained the understanding that they have 30 days in which to claim such mail, and that it will be returned to sender at the expiration of 30 days without any obligation or expense attaching to the addressee. To import goods, have the senders prepay postage and C. O. D. fee, and eventually fail to redeem such importations, necessitating the collection of return-postage from senders, and imposing needless labor on the postal service in handling and re-handling of such matter, is obviously to take an undue advantage of the privileges offered by the

C. O. D. service, and it is desired to bring this situation strongly to the notice of those concerned that the undesirable practice may be corrected immediately. At the same time all patrons of the C. O. D. service are advised that only in cases where senders do not restrict delivery to a fewer number of days will C. O. D. parcels be held 30 days at office of delivery. When senders fix a certain time-limit, not less than 3 nor more than 30 days, C. O. D. matter will be treated accordingly. It is not understood why merchandise would be imported if not wanted, or before it is needed and can be redeemed, and it is sincerely hoped that delinquents who have received first and second notices of the arrival of C. O. D. parcels will appreciate the desirability of removing them promptly.

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

COLONIAL COUNCIL

FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: Mr. Chairman. It has always been my opinion that a member appointed by the Council to sit on a committee should be paid travelling expenses. I propose that members receive compensation for attending committee meetings when appointed by the Council. I do not think this unreasonable by no means.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I consider the proposal made by 4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) fair. May I propose to improve upon his amendment that members be allowed double expenses for attending extraordinary meetings. The Member left the meeting.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander) would like to know the amount paid to Members of the Colonial Council and the Municipal Committee when travelling to attend meetings?

The Chairman answered: Six dollars to Members of the Colonial Council and eight dollars to Members of the Municipal Committee.

1st Appointed Member (Henderson) withdrew his resolution and substituted another.

The Chairman remarked: Before I read the Resolution submitted by the Honorable Member I will put to the vote the proposal made by 4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) that members travelling to meetings on committees appointed by the Council be paid travelling expenses. I wish to draw attention however, that there is no money appropriated for that purpose, therefore I think it best to wait until the next budget.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. As Chairman of the Municipal Committee I wish to state that when the budget was being discussed in the Municipal Committee we adopted the principle that there should not be any increase in salaries above that of last year; the Council having adopted such a motion should not be the first to increase its department. I think it a very bad precedent. I will vote against the amendment.

4th Appointed Member (Blackwood) remarked: I fully agree with the Honorable last Speaker. I do not wish to establish any precedent, but I thought as members are travelling to meetings of committees appointed by the Council they should be paid. I am willing to withdraw my motion and wait until the next budget as suggested by the Chairman.
