LOCAL.

The s. s. William M. Tupper of the Raporel Line arrived at Frederiksted this morning.

THE AMERICAN RED CROSS will within a short time begin a program of work in St. Croix which will, it is hoped, eventually be of material aid in improving health and other conditions on the

Island. Miss Joanna C. Colcord, the Permanent Field Representative for the Virgin Island Chapters, arrived from St. Thomas Dec 11th., and the executive office of the Red Cross will shortly be opened in Christiansted. Permission has kindly been given by the Municipal Committee and by the local Chapter to occupy the rooms in the Municipal Building under the Post Office formerly used by the Christiansted Chapter of the Red Cross; and Miss Colcord's secretary and assistant, Miss Firchild, will arrive this week to assist in beginning the work.

It is expected that a meeting will be called within a few days by Mr. R. L. Merwin, Chairman of the St. Croix Chapter, to which all persons in both towns who are interested in the Red Cross program will be invited. The immediate purpose of this meeting will be to elect officers and consider plans for the annual Roll Call for membership.

Definite work undertaken by the Red Cross and already in progress in St. Croix is as follows:

1. Providing additional supplies and equipment for the local hospitals. In 1917 and 1918, \$44,000 was thus given for the three Municipal Hospitals in St. Thomas and St. Croix, and in August of this year an additional \$15,000 was appropriated for this purpose. These gifts directly benefit everyone of the two Islands who receives treatment through the Municipal Hospitals.

2. Supplying a School Nurse to work with the Departments of Education and Health in improving the physical health of the school children of St. Croix. An experienced Public Health Nurse, Miss Florence R. Freeman, has been appointed to the post, and has already begun her work. The Despatching Secretary has placed a room at her disposal in the Government Building, which will be her headquarters for the present. A committee on Nursing has been appointed by the Red Cross in connection with Miss Freeman's work, whose membership is as follows:

3. Establishment of Public Libraries in Frederiksted and Christiansted. The books and equipment for these Libraries have been provided jointly by the American Library Association and by the Red Cross, the latter organization also providing the trained librarians to install the Libraries. The Chief Librarian, Miss Adeline Zachert, is at present in Christiansted, and will be followed shortly by the Assistant Librarian, Miss Eleanor Gleason.
