After recess the Council reassembled and the Chairman laid before members item 2 of the Order of the Day.

Item 2.

Colonial Council Bill No. 30.

2nd Discussion on Colonial Council Bill No. 30. Draft of an Ordinance, introduced by Government, providing a compiled code of general and

special laws, and altering, amending, repealing and continuing existing laws.

The Chairman remarked: At the last meeting there was placed before you a report and amendments of the Committee and it was agreed upon to take up the first fifty pages of the bill under discussion.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] moved that the Council, adopt the Committee report and that 2nd Discussion be closed.

4th Member for Christiansted Country District [Ramsay] seconded the member's proposal.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll) remarked: Mr. Chairman I am very much in favor of that motion considering that the Committee spent five months in going over the laws.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) Would like to know if it is the intention to close 2nd Discussion on the bill today.

The Chairman answered: It is so proposed by 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District.

The Chairman put to the vote the proposal made by 1st Member for Frederiksted Country District (Andersen) with the result that 9 members voted for; none against.

The Chairman remarked: 2nd Discussion closed.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) remarked: Mr. Chairman. If we are here for fun I would propose that 3rd Discussion come on today.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll) was of the opinion that it would be rushing the matter through if the member's motion was adopted.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] was of the same opinion as the last speaker.

The Chairman remarked: Government does not give consent. Third Discussion will remain open until the next meeting.

2nd Appointed Member [Noll] remarked: Mr. Chairman. A bill was sent to the Chairman late which is not on the Order of the Day; and in order to facilitate people who are to go away I move that the draft of ordinance in regard to libraries be taken up. I might state that there is a representative of the Red Cross here who is willing to establish libraries in both towns. This proposed draft of ordinance calls for a commission, one member to be elected by the Government, one by the Colonial Council and the third to be selected by the Local Chapter of the Red Cross. I move that this matter be placed on the Order of the Day in preference to the Food Commission Bill.

1st Member for Christiansted Town (Abramson) and 5th Appointed Member (Lunney) seconded the member's proposal.

It was put to the vote and carried that the ordinance be taken up as proposed by 2nd Appointed Member (Noll).

The Chairman read the ordinance which is as follows:

Colonial Council Bill No. 31.
2nd Session 1919-20.

Be it enacted by the Colonial Council for St. Croix.

1. There are hereby authorized to be established and maintained in this Municipality two public libraries, each to be known as the "Public Library".

2. The said libraries shall be operated by a board of control to be known as the "Library Commission" and shall be com-
