ing and proper accounting for all monies received by the Police Department

4. He, or the Acting Director of Police shall proceed with all possible dispatch to the scene of any serious disorder or unusual occurrence where his presence may be required and will personally take command of the Municipal Police at such place.

8. A District Chief of Police is the commanding police officer of the district to which he is assigned. He is the representative, within his district of the Director of Police, whose orders he shall receive and obey, to whom he shall submit required reports and to whom he shall be responsible for the proper supervision of Police affairs in the district to which he is assigned.

He shall be responsible for the proper discipline of those under his command, for their efficiency in police work, their compliance with the rules and regulations governing the Municipal Police Force, the proper care of Government property and equipment in his charge and for the maintenance of such records and files as are required by rule or regulation.

9. Inspectors and Sergeants shall perform such duties as may be assigned them by the Chief of Police or District Chief of Police.

10. It is the duty of Inspectors, Sergeants, Patrolmen to protect life and property, prevent crime and disorder and obey the orders of their superior officers; while on patrol duty to constantly patrol the streets and other places on their beats, acquaint themselves with the people by sight, name places of residence and occupation, take possession of lost property found, delivering it to their Commanding Officers; to treat courteously all persons who ask for information or assistance and render proper aid to persons requiring it; to give their names and numbers to any persons who ask for it; to use all possible diligence in securing evidence relating to any crime and to conduct themselves at all times in an orderly, respectful and moral manner.

They shall render protection to people assembled at all public meetings of a lawful nature and maintain order thereat.

They shall thoroughly investigate before making a report, and shall not become involved in disputes or intrigues.

11. The Director of Police, the District Chiefs of Police, and the Inspectors shall be appointed by the Governor. All other members of the Force shall be appointed by the Director of Police.

The Director of Police shall have full power to suspend, with or without pay, discharge, or reduce in grade any appointment made by him.

12. The Director of the Municipal Police is hereby authorized to prepare rules and regulations concerning the detail and duties and to further the proper discipline and maintenance of the Municipal Police Force, and, to provide penalties for the violations of rules and regulations. Appeals for such penalties lie to the Governor, whose decision thereon shall be final.

13. The Director of the Municipal Police Force charged with the management, direction and maintenance of all prisons and jails in St. Croix. He shall be in charge of all property belonging to the prisons and jails, and he shall keep an account of all expenses, and render such reports as may be requested by the Governor.

He shall receive and confine, or cause to be received and confined all persons charged, or hereafter charged, or convicted of an offense against the laws in force in St. Croix, in accordance with the terms of the mittimus or commitment duly issued by a competent authority, and he shall safely keep such persons until discharged by due course of law.

14. The Director of Police is hereby authorized to make all rules and regulations necessary or needful for the control of the prisoners and to provide penalties for the violation thereof.

15. The Ordinance of August 31, 1918, providing for a Municipal Police Force for St. Croix is hereby repealed, excepting sections eleven and twelve thereof.
