TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Belfast, Dec. 21st.--There was little shooting in the city last evening, but a series of raids upon small business places were carried out by armed men, who held up the occupants of stores with revolvers while the cash drawers were rifled. One shop-keeper was dangerously wounded during a hold-up.

Dublin, Dec. 21st. The majority either for or against the Irish treaty will be small; according to the political correspondent of the "Freemans Journal", who warns his readers that "It cannot be made too plain, that the situation remains very grave." Mr. Arthur Griffith and his supporters are struggling to secure ratification, and directing their efforts towards making clear their belief that the choice to be taken is not between the status provided in the treaty and that of an independent republic. They contend that Eamon De Valera's alternative proposals, which have not yet been made public, differ only in a slight degree from the terms of the treaty. Warmly supporting the advocates of ratification, the "Irish Independent" this morning says "In Heaven's name let Ireland take the substance and not dissipate her energies in discussing shadows". Both the "Independent" and the "Freemans Journal" feature the comparison of the oath of allegiance provided for in the treaty, and the oath which, it is said, Mr. De Valera proposes. Both newspapers in their edition refer to the two oaths as "Tweed" dum and tweed-die-dee". 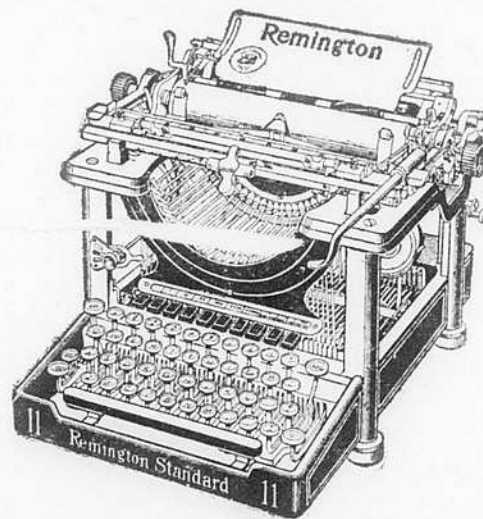
