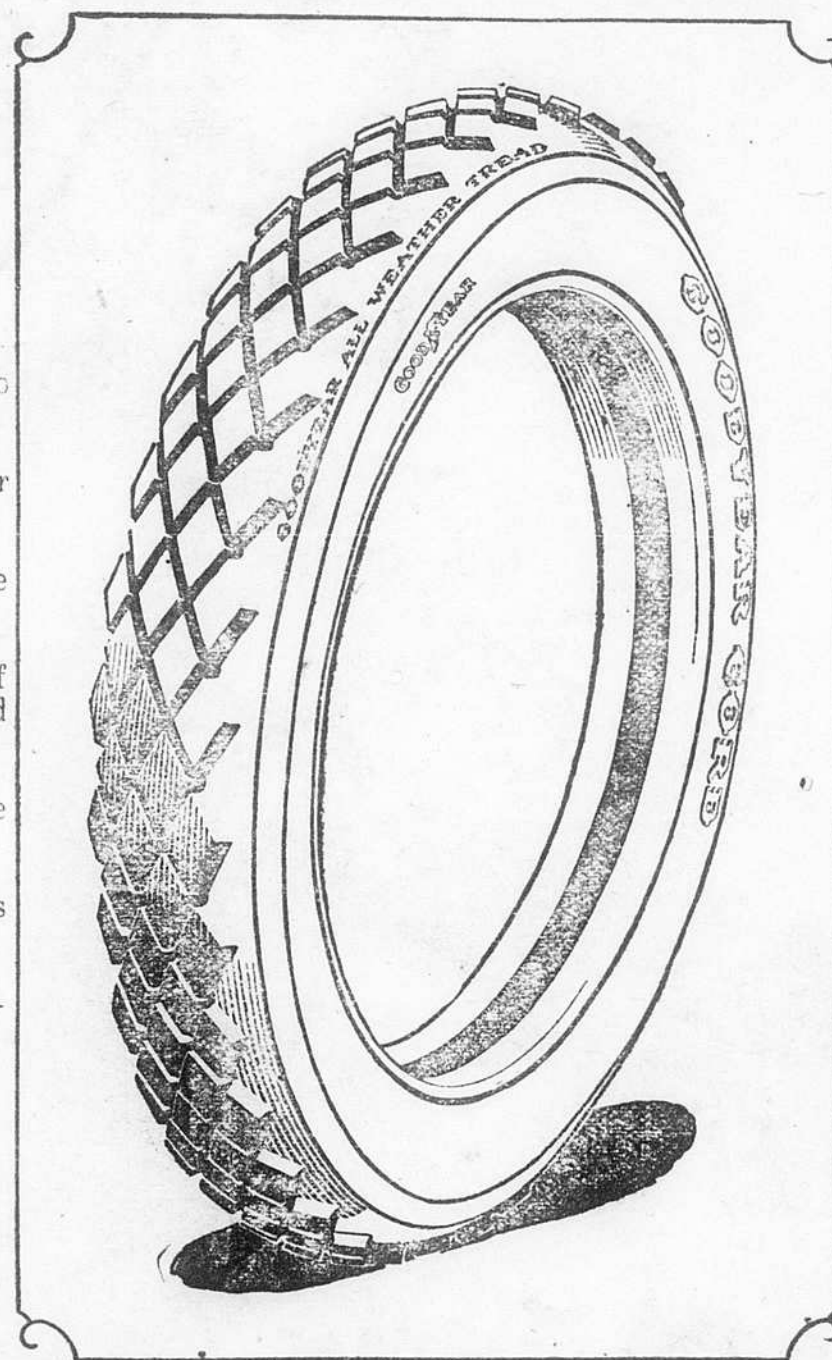

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TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

London, May 21st.—The Peninsular and Oriental Steamship Company announced tonight that the "Egypt" had thirtyeight passengers on board and that twentyeight, who were named as rescued, have been landed at Brest.

Belfast, May 21st.—The Sinn Feiners have begun a new campaign of terrorism in Ulster County. Within twentyfour

hours they have laid a trail of fire from Ulster County down through Belfast to the north of County Antrim, attacking police and barracks, ambushing police, burning the houses of loyalists, destroying railway lines and cutting telegraph communication. Eight deaths resulted from today's disorders in Belfast making 27 murders in the past week. The Ulster cabinet is discussing the situation and important decisions are expected.
