The annual commencement exercises of the Christiansted and Frederiksted Junior High Schools, held on Saturday night, were largely attended, the Christiansted Theatre being filled to capacity with a representative and highly appreciative audience. The program consisted of musical selections by the High School Orchestra; orations, by six of the graduates, three from each town, a spanish song by all the graduates of this town and a clarinet solo by Melville Stevens. TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

San Deigo, Cal., June 27th.—An airplane in flight was refueled for the first time here yesterday. Rushing through the air at 90 miles an hour, Lieutenants Hines and Seifert guided their craft above that flown by Captain Lowell Smith and Lieutenant John P. Richter, ran down a forty foot steel wire encased rubber hose and within two minutes filled the tank of the lower plane. The experiment was in preparation for the attempt of Captain Smith and Lieutenant Richter to attempt to beat all air records for endurance. Today they plan to go up and remain afloat four days and nights.

London, June 27th.—A Central News despatch from Belgrade says six shots were fired at the Jugo Slavian Premier, Nikola Pachitch, as he was leaving Parliament, but that the Premier escaped unharmed. A man named Rajitch was arrested.

New York, June 27th.—The early raw sugar market was unsettled, owing to the irregularity of the futures market. There were sales of 10,000 bags of Cubas to a New Orleans refiner at 5½ cents cost and freight, equal to 7.28 for centrifugal. The raw sugar futures market was irregular. There was renewed liquidation at the opening and first prices showed declines of 7 to 9 points due to the lower
