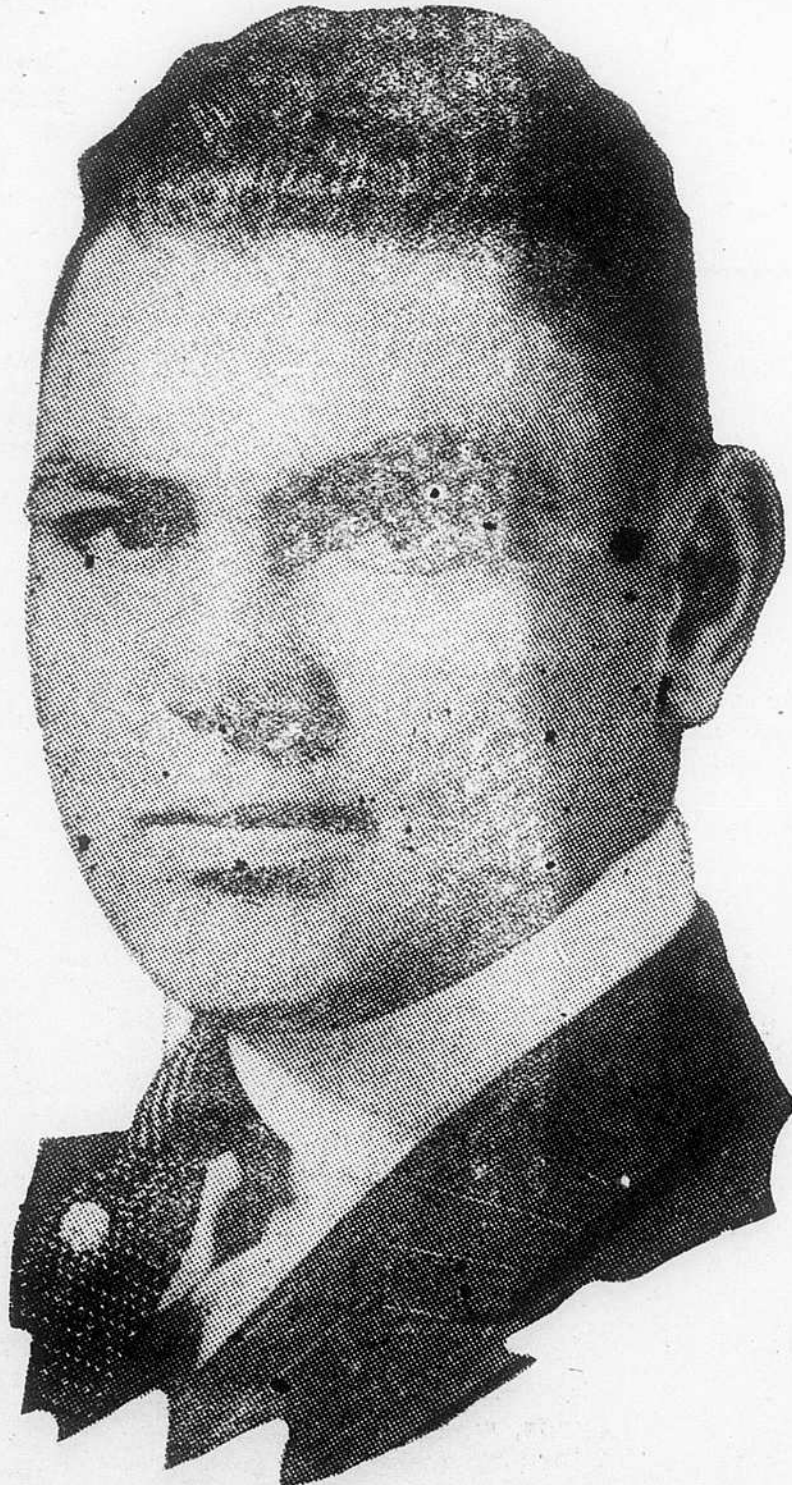

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

(Continued from yesterday's Avis.)

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): Mr. Chairman. I rise to a point of question. I wish to ask whether the bill, as introduced by 4th Member for Frederiksted Country District, is amended by the Committee.

The Chairman: No.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): Are we discussing the passage of a road roller?

The Chairman: No.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): Then this bill is null and void.

The Chairman: That's the Ordinance you have before you.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): Then Paragraph 2 should be struck out.

The Chairman: That's only a detail.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): That's an important detail.

The Chairman: It could be deleted.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): A new bill should be drafted.

The Chairman: The bill had to remain as it is until the Committee Report was adopted, now the Report is adopted it is left to the Council as to what action it would like to take upon it.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town (Alexander): No reservation was made by the Committee; as this bill reads we are voting for \$30,000.

4th Member for Frederiksted Country District (Fleming) remarked: Mr. Chairman. No new bill could be introduced. To my mind a committee would have to be appointed to receive the matter and draft a new bill as to the working of the road roller.

3rd Member for Frederiksted Country District (M. M. Skeoch) proposed that the same Committee be appointed.

3rd Member for Christiansted Town
