The following Members were present: The Chairman (Merwin), A. J. Blackwood, G. B. Fleming, F. Andersen, Holger Jessen, F. Coulter, D. S. Armstrong, A. V. Nelthropp, D. C. Canegata, Robt. W. Skeoch, A. R. McIntosh, J. Alexander, K. Henderson and M. M. Skeoch.

Members W. S. Abramson, D. Noll and Jno. L. Curry sent in excuses of their inability to attend the meeting. Furthermore the 4th Member for Christiansted Country District (Ramsay) was absent.

The Council opened with the following prayer by the Chaplain Rev. H. Piggot.

Most gracious God we humbly beseech Thee, as for the people of this Island in general; so especially for their representatives in Council assembled that Thou wouldest be pleased to direct and prosper all their consultations to the glory and welfare of Thy people; that all things may be so ordered and settled by their endeavors upon the best and surest foundations, that peace and happiness, truth and justice, reli-

gion and piety may be established among us for all generations.

This we humbly ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Chairman remarked: Honorable Members, the minutes of the last meeting have been published as customary in the "St. Croix Avis" and if there is no objection I will consider same tacitly adopted.

2nd Member for Christiansted Town (Canegata) said, Mr. Chairman, I did not enter the meeting at the time stated in the proceedings, if I did at that time, there are certain remarks that were made that I would have objected to.

There being no further objections the Chairman declared the minutes tacitly adopted.

His Excellency, the Governor Sumner E. W. Kittelle, Government Secretary (Gaffney) and Despatching Secretary (Rappolee) entered the meeting.

The Chairman remarked: Since the last meeting we have had the occasion of the Silver Wedding of the Governor and on behalf of the Council I sent the following:
