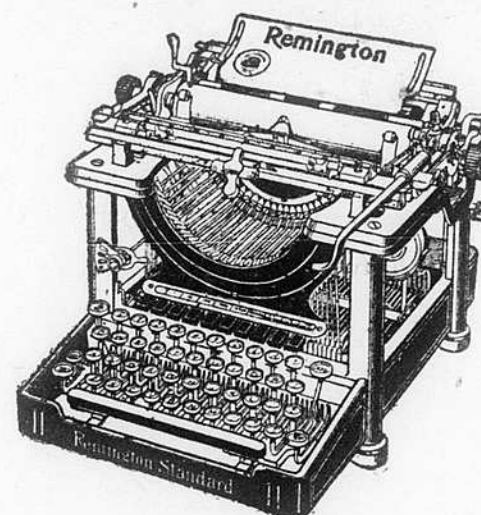

RESUMPTION OF MONEY ORDER
SERVICE WITH THE LEEWARD
ISLANDS

EFFECTIVE at once the exchange of money orders between the United States and the Leeward Islands (embracing Antigua, Dominica, Monserrat, Nevis, St. Kitts, and Tortola), temporarily suspended in May last, is resumed by mutual agreement of the two countries, and previous notice advising the suspension of money order business between the Virgin Islands of the United States and the Leeward Islands Colony is hereby modified accordingly.
