WHY CHANGE OUR GOVERNOR
MAJORITY OF ST. THOMIANS WOULD
LIKE HIM SERVE A SECOND TERM.

Who is going to be our next Governor? This is one of the questions that is being considered most by the inhabitants of St. Thomas at the present time. But above all conjecture, is heard expressed the wish that Rear Admiral J. W. Oman be retained in his present incumbency for at least another term. And this with good reason.

We have always considered it an unwise policy to change our officials as frequently as is done especially those whose administration give satisfaction to the majority of those they govern.

The chief point in opposition to the practice of a one-time incumbency of office, and the only one we mention, is the fact that such changes are generally made just at the time when both sides have begun to appreciate the efforts, or position of the other, also leaving the policy of the former administration to be carried out by his successor, who, not having the knowledge gained by, or the mind of his predecessor, may be inclined to adopt a radical change of policy.

This in turn, not suiting the people's condition, and therefore not being conducive towards their happiness or prosperity, must, most naturally cause dissatisfaction and distrust; or in a word, plant the seed whence all the evil that divides two people must spring.

Most St. Thomians have given up the idea which they acquired thru their fervent patriotism that every man who is an American, or every article which is American, must necessarily be good. They have learned to realize that while American institutions have produced the best type of administrator, that while the greatest of philanthropy is stretched forth from America even unto the uttermost ends of the earth to rescue and succor suffering
