LOCAL.

The Creole due this morning has not arrived. There was a strong northerly wind last night; possibly it was too strong and she didn't sail.

Besides "Tropical Love" which was repeated at St. Mary's Hall last night, there were screened a comic number, a pathetic episode featuring a little girl's love for her old grandfather, a really touching picture, and an extra to conclude. Tropical Love is not a common picture but a fine film with Ruth Clifford the heroine of the Invisible Ray and other stunning serials as the principal character. The attendance at the exhibition production ought to be greater both from a paying point of view and because the picture is well worth seeing. A very restful evening was afforded the audience last night.

The Native Brass Band enlivened the town last night with one of its stirring popular concerts which terminated with a march up town, a jolly crowd keeping time with the music.

American Red Cross.

The Junior Red Cross in Porto Rico is campaigning for clean teeth, clean finger nails and clean bodies among the children in the public schools of the island. A bulletin on Health Measures and Educational Projects of the Juniors has been sent by Francisco Vizcarrondo, Chairman of the Junior Red Cross, to all local chairmen suggesting that copies be furnished every teacher in their district. This bulletin urges that more thought be given to the expenditures by the local auxiliaries and that the greatest good be done to the greatest number.

"Primarily the Junior Red Cross stands for the promotion of happiness through relief in distress, health measures and educational advancement", is the key message. It is felt by Junior officials that the happiness which comes from medicine, food, and clothing is more lasting than that from toys and candy.

Children should be advised to have their teeth looked over once a year without fail. Already six dental clinics started by the Junior Red Cross are in operation. If the children cannot pay for the services of a dentist, therefore, they can always be sent to a Red Cross or municipal dentist.

The Juniors are supporting two doctors in rural health work whose purpose it is to serve the pupils of the rural schools making examinations, furnishing standard medicines and recommending follow up work.

Teachers are asked to have an inspection of finger nails and hands as a part of school drill and also to see that soap and paper towels are available wherever possible. Likewise, a careful inspection of feet is advised and no child allowed to enter the schoolroom with muddy shoes. As for the teeth, the Executive Committee of the Junior Red Cross is putting both tooth brushes and paste within the reach of all rural pupils.

The Porto Rican Juniors are supporting two French children as well as offering scholarship to local pupils in local schools. Five additional scholarships have been offered to grade teachers who wish to specialize in home economics. Miss Pilar Martinez of the Ponce High School, who has held the Junior Red Cross Normal scholarship at the University of Porto Rico for the past two years has made a splendid record and has been retained as student instructor in the University for the coming year.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Genoa, April 21st.—The economic conference today made a great stride forward. The elimination of the Russo-German treaty from the controversy and Soviet Russia's provisional acceptance of the Allied considerations concerning foreign debts and confiscated property of foreigners, produced a very definite hope that the greatest congress European statesmen ever held will accomplish something real and tangible for the reconstruction of Europe, including Russia. The conciliatory nature of the answers of the Soviet Government contributed to the optimism that the Bolsheviks earnestly seek an arrangement with the powers by which Soviet Russia will be permitted to enter into the community of nations. The clear and brief demands of the Allies, which afford a concrete basis for discussion, are compared here by the observers to the concrete United States proposals for naval limita-
