TELEGRAMS.

ST. CROIX STATION.

Paris, March 21st.—The Press unanimously agrees upon the magnificent success of the new loan, despite unfavourable foreign and domestic circumstances. The result is a notable demonstration of the National solidarity and the confidence of the people in the future of France. The "Journal" estimate the total at about eighteen milliards of francs.

Paris, March 23rd.—The "Matin" learns from London, with reference to the elaboration of the treaty with Turkey, that the Diplomatic Council has terminated its study of Marshal Foch's report, but has not yet reached a complete agreement on the extent of the zones to be neutralized on the two sides of the straits.

Paris, March 20th.—French official circles declare that they have no knowledge of the Note from the Supreme Council, which Lord Kilmarnock the British Charge d'Affaires at Berlin, is stated to have delivered to Vice Chancellor Schiffer, declaring expressly that the Entente would not deliver supplies to a monarchist or Soviet Germany, but only to a democratic Germany.

Bucharest, March 14th.—The army of the Ukraine has resumed the offensive against the Bolsheviki and occupied a section of territory hitherto held by the latter. Thirty thousand insurgents have occupied Ekaterinavsk and Poltava, and the Bolshevik commissary has abandoned Keiff, and established itself at Kharkoff, according to a despatch from the Hava's Agency.

Berlin, March 21st.—The Majority Socialists and Independents have agreed to invite the workmen to resume work tomorrow. The resignations of Herr Noske and Herr Seine are confirmed. Advices from Aix-La Chapelle state that sanguinary encounters have taken place on the basin of the Ruhr, the Govt. troops retreating, a part of them being captured and imprisoned. Some Russian elements and former German officers cooperated with the Spartacists, who repudiate any hostile intention towards the troops of the Allies.
