PROCEEDINGS OF THE COLONIAL COUNCIL FOR ST. CROIX.

Item 2.

Colonial Council Bill No. 7.

Resolution—That the name "SAINT CROIX" is the official name of this Island and the name "MUNICIPALITY of ST. CROIX" shall hereafter be used in officially designating this Municipality. Introduced by 2nd Appointed Member (Noll).

RESOLUTION.

Be it resolved by the Colonial Council for St. Croix in Session assembled:

That the name "SAINT CROIX" is the official name of this island and the name "MUNICIPALITY of ST. CROIX" shall hereafter be

used in officially designating this municipality in any public voucher, contract or document.

2nd Appointed Member.

The Chairman remarked: The fact that the Treaty has fixed the name "St. Croix" to this Island is sufficient to establish the fact that it is the official name given to the Island, but as the name Santa Cruz is often used in officially designating the Island it is thought best to bring this Resolution before the Council.

Porto Rico was first owned by Spain and when it became an American possession it then became necessary to determine whether its official name should be Porto Rico or Puerto Rico and their legislature had to take a vote on the question. Now the same question has come to us in this Island, and it is with this object that the member has introduced his resolution so that the various departments can use the official name.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll) in introducing the Resolution said that he had no particular remarks to make, but personally he thinks as the name St. Croix is used in the Treaty it is sufficient to establish the fact that it is the official name of this Island.

It was then put to the vote and carried that the Resolution be furthered.

It was also put to the vote and carried that the Resolution be adopted at one discussion.

No one requested the word further, the Secretary (Canegata) read the Resolution and the Chairman put same to the vote.

It was unanimously adopted.

Item 3.

RESOLUTION.

Be it resolved by the Colonial Council for St. Croix in Session assembled:

That the funds appropriated in the budget for the present fiscal year for maintenance, under the Street and Land Divisions of the Public Works Department, shall be available for paying salaries to regularly employed watchmen, caretakers and lamp-lighters of Divisions, and such payments shall be passed in the accounts of the

Disbursing Officer of the Colonial Treasury.

2nd Appointed Member.

2nd Appointed Member (Noll) introduced the bill and said that all the money appropriated for the Street Department under the Public Works Department is budgeted under maintenance and as there are no salaries provided for the men employed under that branch of the Department it is thought necessary to bring this Resolution before the Council so as to provide salaries for them.

Despatching Secretary (O'Hagan) remarked: Mr. Chairman. There seems to be, according to my mind, some few technicalities which should be taken care of so as to protect the Disbursing Officer. The budget specifically provides for salaries under all departments; and also under Public Works Department in the Administrative Division. The salaries appropriated are just sufficient to care for the Administrative Officers, such as, the Assistant Public Works Officer, the Building and Street Inspector's Divisions, but we have regularly employed men who act as caretakers and lamplighters and the like; while I feel sure that it is the intention of the Council that the salaries of these regularly employed men come out of maintenance, some question might arise in the mind of an auditor as to the propriety of doing this, and I therefore thought it necessary to have this point settled by the Council.

It was then put to the vote and carried that the Resolution be furthered.

It was also put to the vote and carried that the Resolution be adopted at one discussion.

No one requested the word further, the Secretary (Canegata) read the Resolution and the Chairman put same to the vote.

It was unanimously adopted.

The Chairman then gave a recess of 20 minutes.

3rd Appointed Member (Armstrong) entered the meeting during the recess.

After recess the Council reassembled and the Chairman laid before members item 4 of the Order of the Day.

Item 4. Colonial Council Bill No. 9.

Resolution—That the Governor is hereby authorized to rent or lease, for such amounts as in his judgement shall seem proper, any public land or buildings not necessary for public use etc. Introduced by 2nd Appointed Member (Noll)
