

does not allow Trailers on their roads; they are now building houses and putting men at certain distances along the roads to report any damage done to the roads, but small repairs have to be done all the time.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] remarked: Mr. Chairman. I did not quite understand whether the Public Works Officer said that the Chairman of the Road Commission has to look after all the work himself. An Inspector might be sent around once a month or so to see that the repairs called for by the Road Commission are actually carried out.

Public Works Officer (Lieut. Pettigrew) remarked: Mr. Chairman. I think on the part of Government I would be glad to have Inspectors to go around all the year through, but the roads cannot be kept as they ought to be kept while we are having showers in between.

5th Appointed Member (Lunney) remarked: Mr. Chairman. When Public Works Officer Church was here he brought in a new Road Ordinance to replace the Ordinance we are now working under, but that was rejected by the Council. It requires a new Road Ordinance to straighten up matters where the roads are concerned. The Members of the Road Commission are not receiving any salary, and as a result everything is left with the Chairman; even when you go to the Police Station and make complaints you have to satisfy the police that the person has refused to repair his road before he is compelled to do so.

With the trucks running on the roads today, if we had a wet season, we would have a pretty good time with the roads. [The Member then read a statement of the amount spent for repairs to roads and bridges for the fiscal year,] and continuing said, "There is a balance of Fres. 17,541.85 on hand from the amount appropriated. Further the Member said: "I think we have worked very economically; and when it comes to traveling expenses, the amount I am receiving is not sufficient to cover my traveling expenses."

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] proposed that discussion on the budget be postponed until the next meeting of the Council.

Government Secretary Timmons remarked that Government has no objection whatever; the only point was that some action must be taken on the budget before July 1st.

The Chairman remarked: If discussion on the budget is postponed it means that we must have a meeting of the Council next Monday to get it through.

1st Member for Frederiksted Country District [Andersen] remarked: Mr. Chairman. In order to get the budget through today I will bring in an amendment.
