The S. S. Korona from New York arrived at Frederiksted on Saturday evening. There were not many passengers for this island, but there was a fairly large mail consisting of some 45 sacks.

The schooner Virginia reached Frederiksted yesterday morning with 105 bags mail. The States mail via Porto Rico was by the "Ponce" and the "Floridian" the postmaster says, and there is no information yet to hand as regards whether or not there was any mail for the Virgin Islands on the "Philadelphia".

It is now understood that advices have been received lifting the prohibition ban as far as the Virgin Islands is concerned, the 18th. amendment being declared inapplicable to this territory. Thus beer and light wines will again become legitimate by saleable.

HERE AND THERE

THE PATHFINDER says the origin of the term "shinplaster" dates back to the Civil war when the name was applied to paper money of any kind, especially to fractional parts of a dollar.
